ACTING AS AN EXPERT WITNESS IN AN IP DISPUTE

Expert evidence plays an important—and sometimes pivotal—role in intellectual property dispute resolution. However, the roles and responsibilities of the expert in preparing a report or giving witness testimony is often misunderstood or shrouded in mystery.

This full day course seeks to introduce participants to the world of expert evidence with a focus on patent and IP valuation disputes, whether in court or before a tribunal (e.g. in arbitration proceedings).

The course will cover:

- What expert evidence is about, and the general duties and obligations of an expert witness
- Tracks catering to patent law / practice or IP valuation, which will run concurrently
- Step-by-step overview of the entire process from engagement to the end of the trial/hearing, with practical guidance on administrative aspects (e.g. contractual agreement and remuneration)

Upon completion of the course, subject-matter experts who qualify (e.g. Principal Investigator/Lead Scientist/Research Group Lead or equivalent, and above) and professional valuers who qualify will be included in a list of technical/valuation experts maintained by IPOS, which parties to a patent or other IP-related dispute can consider appointing as an expert witness. Those on the list may also be invited to join the WIPO List of Neutrals.

(Note: Inclusion in the list of experts is not a requirement for being able to act as an expert witness in a dispute. Those who have previously acted as expert witnesses or assessors can also ask to be included in the list without attending the course.)

PROF LESLIE CHEW, SENIOR COUNSEL
Dean, School of Law, Singapore University of Social Sciences
Senior Consultant, RHT Law Asia LLP, Singapore

Leslie is the founding and current Dean of the School of Law at the Singapore University of Social Sciences. Leslie served as District Judge from 2007 to 2014. He has practiced law in one form or another for over 4 decades. He was appointed Senior Counsel in 2000. Currently, he is a Senior Consultant at RHT Law Asia LLP and practices as counsel and arbitrator in international commercial disputes.



MR MARK LIM

Mark is a Director and Chief Legal Counsel at IPOS (the Intellectual Property Office of Singapore), where he heads the Hearings & Mediation Department.

JUSTICE VALERIE THEAN
High Court Judge, Supreme Court

Justice Valerie Thean has been a High Court Judge of the Supreme Court since 30 September 2017. She was first appointed Judicial Commissioner on 30 September 2014 (and concurrently, Presiding Judge of the Family Justice Courts from 1 October 2014 until 29 September 2017). She is at present one of the judges on the IP list at the General Division of the High Court.

Justice Thean obtained her law degree at Downing College, Cambridge University as a recipient of the President's Scholarship, and holds a Master of Laws from Harvard Law School. Prior to joining the bench, Justice Thean was with the Singapore Legal Service, and has held various postings within the service, including as a Justices' Law Clerk, Assistant Registrar at the Supreme Court, District Judge at the then Subordinate Courts, Senior State Counsel at the Attorney General's Chambers, Director-General (Legal) and Deputy Secretary of the Ministry of Law and Senior District Judge of the Family and Juvenile Justice Division of the State Courts. She was also previously an Adjunct Associate Professor at the National University of Singapore Law Faculty.



MS ESTHER YANG
Director, Legal Services, Creative Technology Ltd

After leaving practice as a commercial litigator, Esther has been in-house at Creative Technology Ltd for over 10 years. She oversees general Dispute Resolution and looks after the company's Intellectual Property portfolio. This includes all registration, prosecution and maintenance work related to the company's Intellectual Property portfolio. She is responsible for defence of the portfolio and brand protection, which often involves Trade Mark litigation, anti-counterfeiting strategies and licensing.

In recent years, she has spent more time focused on IP licensing and Patent Litigation in the US. She has managed lawsuits filed in District Court, at the International Trade Commission, and also cases which have been appealed to the Federal Circuit. Since most, if not all of these lawsuits involved technical issues, she has been involved in the selection of expert witnesses and has experience working with them.

Having been involved in lawsuits as either Plaintiff or Defendant, she is familiar with the factors involved when on either side. Pre-pandemic, she travelled frequently to the US to work with US external counsel when preparing for these trials.

In addition to IP litigation, she also manages commercial lawsuits of varying sizes in Singapore and in other countries around the world, some of which have gone to trial, and some of which have been settled via negotiation or formal mediation.
