He also serves as one of the Vice-Chairpersons of the Singapore Legal Service's Technology Law Cluster, a community of public sector lawyers who are developing expertise in technology law in order to bridge law, technology, and policy, so as to help the Singapore Government address its fast-evolving technology needs and chart Singapore's digital future.



JOYCE TAN

Managing Director, Joyce A Tan & Partners

Joyce A. Tan PBM is Managing Director of the eponymous law firm she established, a business-centric law practice with particular strengths in intellectual property and TMT.

Joyce A. Tan's expert opinion was relied upon and heavily quoted in the 2020 judgment in the Singapore High Court case of 3 Corporate Services Pte Ltd v. Grabtaxi Holding Pte Ltd (Suit No. 682 of 2018). This was the first fully litigated case in Singapore on cybersquatting, which attracted unsolicited media attention. This included The Straits Times which quoted Joyce for her concluded opinion on the existence of cybersquatting on the facts of the case, in the absence of any specific legal definition of the expression under prevailing Singapore laws.

YEONG ZEE KIN
Assistant Chief Executive (Data Innovation and Protection Group),
Infocomm Media Development Authority of Singapore and Deputy
Commissioner, Personal Data Protection Commission

Zee Kin is presently the Assistant Chief Executive (Data Innovation and Protection Group) of the Infocomm Media Development Authority of Singapore (IMDA). His scope of work includes developing forward-thinking governance on AI and data, Zee Kin spearheaded the development of Singapore's Model AI Governance Framework, which won the UNITU WSIS Prize in 2019.

Zee Kin concurrently holds the appointment of Deputy Commissioner of the Personal Data Protection Commission (PDPC) and oversees the administration and enforcement of the Personal Data Protection Act (2012). His key responsibilities include managing the formulation and implementation of policies relating to the protection of personal data, as well as the issuing of enforcement directions for organisational actions. Zee Kin also oversaw the development of Singapore's Personal Data Protection Act, as well as the proposed amendments to the Act in 2020.

Zee Kin is an internationally recognized expert on AI ethics. He is currently a member of the OECD Network of Experts on AI (ONE AI). In 2019, Zee Kin was a member of the AI Group of Experts at the OECD (AIGO), which developed the OECD Principles on AI. These principles have been endorsed by the G20 in 2019.

Zee Kin is also a well-regarded expert on data privacy issues. He has contributed to publications on legal issues relating to data privacy, and has spoken at many well-recognised international and domestic platforms on this topic. He is currently participating as an expert in the Global Partnership on AI (GPAI)'s Data Governance Working Group, which addresses data protection issues at the intersection of AI development and deployment.

In addition, Zee Kin has spoken and published in areas relating to electronic evidence and intellectual property, as well as legal issues relating to Blockchain and AI deployment. Formerly a partner in Rajah & Tann LLP's iTec (intellectual property, technology, entertainment and communications) practice group, his experience as a Technology, Media and Telecommunications lawyer spans both public and private sector.

Zee Kin is also the Chairperson of the Singapore Legal Service's Technology Law Cluster, a community of public sector lawyers who are developing expertise in technology law in order to bridge law, technology, and policy, so as to help the Singapore Government address its fast-evolving technology needs and chart Singapore's digital future.
