Her work covers formulation and implementation of policies relating to AI Governance and Ethics as well as cross-border data flows. She has represented Singapore at various international platforms discussing AI ethics and governance issues, such as the intergovernmental consultations on UNESCO's Recommendation on the Ethics of AI. She is currently an expert involved in the OECD's Working Party on AI Governance (WPAIGO). She is also an Advocate and Solicitor of the Singapore Bar.

Cheryl is a Director with the Corporate & Finance Department in Drew & Napier. Her key areas of practice are Telecommunications, Media & Technology, and Administrative & Public Law. Cheryl advises clients on the Payment Services Act 2019, covering different types of payment structures to the issuance of non-fungible tokens (NFTs). She also advises clients on legal issues arising from the use of artificial intelligence ("AI"), from compliance with Singapore's data protection laws when using AI to process personal data, to intellectual property and liability issues arising from the implementation of a ChatGPT-like system in the workplace to answer questions and generate documents and code.

Jeth read law at the National University of Singapore, where he was chief editor of the law review. He holds a master's degree in corporate law from New York University, and is qualified as an advocate and solicitor.

Daryl Lim is the H. Laddie Montague Jr. Chair in Law at Penn State Dickinson Law and Co-Hire at the Institute of Computational and Data Sciences at Penn State University. He is also the Associate Dean for Research and Innovation and Founding Director of the Intellectual Property (IP) Law and Innovation Initiative.

Daryl Lim is an award-winning author, observer, and commentator on IP and competition policy trends and how they influence and are influenced by law, technology, economics, and politics. He helps stakeholders understand the world around them. He consults internationally on various IP and antitrust issues.

He is a founding member of the Global IP Alliance and its local chapters in Pennsylvania and Illinois. In addition, he serves as Co-Chair of the University Education Committee and on the Executive Committee of the US IP Alliance. In December 2022, the American Law Institute elected Professor Lim to its membership based on demonstrated excellence and outstanding professional achievement.

He recently signed a book deal with Oxford University Press for a new book titled *Infringement in Intellectual Property Law*. His publications feature in leading flagship and specialty law reviews. Thomson Reuters (West) selected two of his articles as the best IP articles of the year in 2018 and 2021. He has also contributed to practitioner-focused publications for the American Bar Association, *Law360*, *IPWatchdog*, *IP Watch*, and *IP Magazine*. In addition, legal publications, specialty blogs such as *Patently-O*, and mainstream media sources such as *Forbes*, *Slate*, *The Daily Journal*, *RealClearPolicy*, and *USA Today* featured his views on current legal developments. In addition, he serves as a peer reviewer for the *Yale Law Journal*, *Journal of Empirical Legal Studies*, *Journal of Antitrust Enforcement* (Oxford University Press), Cambridge University Press, John Wiley & Sons, Carolina Academic Press, and the *International Review of Intellectual Property and Competition Law*.

YEONG ZEE KIN
Assistant Chief Executive (Data Innovation and Protection Group),

Executive, Singapore Academy of Law (SAL)

Zee Kin is presently the Assistant Chief Executive (Data Innovation and Protection Group) of the Infocomm Media Development Authority of Singapore (IMDA). His scope of work includes developing forward-thinking governance on

AI and data, Zee Kin spearheaded the development of Singapore's Model AI Governance Framework, which won the UNITU WSIS Prize in 2019.

In his capacity as Deputy Commissioner of the Personal Data Protection Commission (PDPC), Zee Kin oversees the development, administration and enforcement of the Personal Data Protection Act (2012). His key responsibilities include overseeing the administration and enforcement of the Personal Data Protection Act (2012), the formulation and implementation of policies relating to the protection of personal data, as well as the issuing of enforcement directions for organisational actions. Zee Kin also oversaw the development of Singapore's Personal Data Protection Act, as well as the proposed amendments to the Act in 2020. Since April 2023, Zee Kin concurrently holds the appointment of Chief Executive at the Singapore Academy of Law (SAL).

Zee Kin is an internationally recognized expert on AI ethics. He is currently a member of the OECD Network of Experts on AI (ONE AI). In 2019, Zee Kin was a member of the AI Group of Experts at the OECD (AIGO), which developed the OECD Principles on AI. These principles have been endorsed by the G20 in 2019. Zee Kin is also a well-regarded expert on data privacy issues. He has contributed to publications on legal issues relating to data privacy, and has spoken at many well-recognised international and domestic platforms on this topic. He is a member of OECD's informal advisory group for the revision of the Supplementary Memorandum of the OECD Privacy Guidelines. He is also currently participating as an expert in the Global Partnership on AI (GPAI)'s Data Governance Working Group, which addresses data protection issues at the intersection of AI development and deployment.

In addition, Zee Kin has spoken and published in areas relating to electronic evidence and intellectual property, as well as legal issues relating to Blockchain and AI deployment. Formerly a partner in Rajah & Tann LLP's iTec (intellectual property, technology, entertainment and communications) practice group, his experience as a Technology, Media and Telecommunications lawyer spans both public and private sector.
